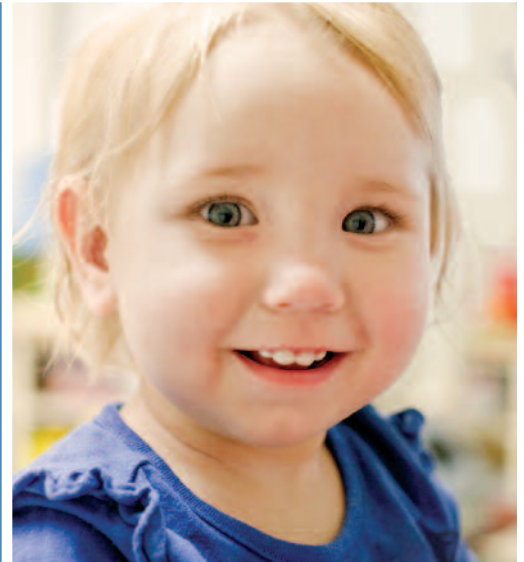

COURSE OVERVIEW AND OBJECTIVES

Continuous advances in clinical science require pediatric primary care practitioners to obtain comprehensive, up-to-date information on a wide range of medical issues encountered in daily practice. Based on the identified clinical challenges of past course participants, the Pediatric Clinical Update – South Bay will focus on current evaluation and management strategies in these selected clinical areas: behavior/mental health, endocrinology, otolaryngology, dermatology, immunology, gastroenterology, urology and neurology.

Courses Objectives:

- Evaluate current screening, diagnosis and treatment strategies for pediatric patients presenting with the following selected diseases and disorders in order to enhance patient management: Asthma, Type 1 Diabetes Mellitus, Sinusitis, ADHD, Atopic Dermatitis
- Employ current return to play guidelines after head trauma
- Utilize recommended techniques for nutritional assessment of children in order to improve their outcomes
- Determine which patients should be referred to a pediatric urologist for appropriate specialty intervention
