Course Overview and Objectives

Popular Pediatric Clinical Topics 2009 will focus on current management strategies for a variety of clinical issues in core areas of general pediatric practice including Cardiology, Dermatology, Gastroenterology, Infectious Diseases, Neurology/Neurosurgery, Orthopedics and Psychiatry. Selected clinical topics have been identified by past conference participants as of particular importance in daily pediatric practice.

A key objective is to provide participants with the opportunity to discuss practice dilemmas with the expert faculty.

Course Objectives:

- Evaluate current screening, diagnosis and treatment strategies for pediatric patients presenting with the following selected diseases and disorders in order to enhance patient management:
 - MRSA infection
 - Recurrent abdominal pain
 - Congenital heart disease
 - Warts and molluscum contagiosum
 - Scabies and lice infestations
 - Acne
 - Constipation and encopresis
 - ADHD
 - Depression
 - Developmental dysplasia of the hip
 - Rotational and angular deformities of the lower extremity
 - Adolescent anterior knee pain
 - Cranial deformities
 - Cerebrovascular disease and stroke
- Employ current return to play guidelines after head trauma
- Evaluate the role of health care practitioners in supporting mental health in schools
- Apply enhanced skills in cardiac auscultation and interpretation of pediatric ECGs
- Utilize recommended techniques for nutritional assessment of children in order to improve their outcomes
- Assess the latest immunization schedule updates including disease specific issues
